Annual Meeting August 5, 2023

The Sanbornton Bay Association was founded in 1953. *This is the 70th anniversary!*

- I. The meeting was called to order by Doug Norton, President, at 9:01am.
 - The meeting was in person at 116 Gray Road.
 - There were 18 attendees.
- II. The Minutes of the August 20, 2022 Annual Meeting were accepted.
 - Base dues are \$20 per year, \$25 with name plate on a SBA road sign.

III. Election of Officers

IV. Boat parade

- It was wonderful weather.
- There were 22 participants.
- Boat signage was raised as an issue, due to a vulgar flag displayed on the boat of a participant.

V. Road signs

- SBA signs are restricted to SBA members.
- Three signs left to go.
- Lower Smith has no residents listed.

VI. Town of Sanbornton Report - Bob Lambert

- Attended the Winnisquam Watershed Network annual meeting on July 22, 2023 at the Belmont Town Beach.
- 1700 boat inspections have been conducted Year to Date.
- Census: There 25 loons, four eagles.
- Social event at Waldron Bay from 3-6pm, Saturday August 12.
- **Sanbornton Police**
 - The department is at full staffing.
 - The new Police Station is completed.

- Roadway speed enforcement is being picked up.
- Local news outlets have ceased carrying area police department reports. They are being approached to reinstate reporting.

- **Sanbornton Highway Department**

- Road wash-out repairs across town are underway. They are being triaged by priority.
- Bob is on the WWN board representing Sanbornton. The WWN is working on grant funds for road repairs/run off to go before the town and the Town Warrant; Dr. True Road is a high priority that includes Maple Circle with a critical run off issue.

- **Parks & Recreation Department**

- A new shed donated by Amanda Grappone has been installed at the Town Park
- A Grant has been received for Town Park improvements including a well, and tennis and pickle ball courts.

Other

- Black Brook Road has beaver problems which have been exacerbated with the summer's rains.
- Barbara Allard spoke regarding boat wakes being an issue this summer, with impact at the shoreline.
 - No Wake is a State of NH issue. Bob Lambert suggested talking with State Sen. Tim Lang who resides in Sanbornton.
 - High water will continue to be an issue.

- The Balance Sheet is healthy. Mark asked if dues should be suspended?
 - The consensus was to keep the dues as they are and look at increasing contributions to WWN by \$500, and the Loon Preservation Committee by \$300.

Other

- Discussion regarding town road, Lower Bay Road usage:
 - Out-of-town heavy equipment traffic on Lower Bay Road is averaging 80 vehicles/week which over time will affect the condition of the roads; Bob Lambert advised that federal funds were used for the town road maintenance, which prevents limitation of use.
 - There is speeding.
 - Road line markings (center and fog) are absent on town roads
 - Winter salt usage on Lower Bay near the shoreline appears heavy.
 - Winter road, snow crews are hired out; Bob will bring it to the attention of the town.
